Quiet Time


WORD UP! God provided the Savior!

John 1:12



Connect the dots while saying your memory verse to see what God sent Abraham.

Day 1

3 PRAY ABOUT IT!

Pray and thank God for giving you the Bible so you can know more about Him.

2 THINK ABOUT IT!

Psalms are songs. The Psalms in the Bible are songs the Israelites would sing to God. This Psalm talks a lot about who God is. When you read the Bible, ask yourself three questions: "What does it say?" "What does it mean?" and "What is God saying to me?" We will look more at these questions this week. As you read God's Word, pray that God will help you answer these questions so you can know Him more.

Day 2

—Psalm 46:1


3 PRAY ABOUT IT!

Read Psalm 46:1 as a prayer to God and thank Him for being your refuge, strength, and help.

2 THINK ABOUT IT!
What does it say?

Have you ever built a fort or fortress? Another word for "fort" or "fortress" is "refuge." A fortress protects you from the enemy. This psalm says God is our refuge in trouble. If you have believed in Jesus as your Savior, you can trust God even when life gets hard. Depend on Him and remember He is your refuge, strength, and help!

3 PRAY ABOUT IT!

Thank God for giving you His Word so you can know He is always there to help you.

2 THINK ABOUT IT!
What does it mean?

Life isn't perfect and hard things sometimes happen, but God is stronger than anything that could ever happen. He didn't just work in the past. He doesn't just work in the future. He's also here in the present—right now. God wants you to depend on His strength [power] to be your refuge [fortress] when trouble [problems] happen in life.
